## <u>The Gorgeous Jaguar D-Type Is</u> <u>Going Back Into (very limited)</u> Production

#### 25-car D-Type continuation run inaugurated by engineering prototype in Paris!

Fresh from completing nine continuation series examples of the XKSS, Jaguar is turning its attention to another notable gap in its production history: finishing up that 100-car run of the D-Type race car Jaguar will build 25 new examples of the D-Type 62 years after the last example of the breed rolled out of the factory.

The D-Type is best known for winning the 24 Hours of Le Mans three times between 1955 and 1957, and Jaguar Land Rover Classic plans to hand build these six-cylinder-engine race cars based on the original engineering drawings and records, in Shortnose and Longnose form.



Jaguar showed off the first engineering prototype at the annual Salon Retromobile in Paris, previewing the full 25-car run to be completed.

"The Jaguar D-type is one of the most iconic and beautiful competition cars of all time, with an outstanding record in the world's toughest motor races," said Tim Hannig, Jaguar Land Rover Classic director. "And it's just as spectacular today. The opportunity to continue the D-type's success story, by completing its planned production run in Coventry, is one of those once-in-a-lifetime projects that our worldclass experts at Jaguar Land Rover Classic are proud to fulfill."

There was an XKSS continuation car at the Browns Lane factory just over a year ago, when Jaguar Land Rover Classic began the process of building the nine-car run. The automaker's classic division had taken 3-D measurements of the existing cars as part of its engineering and assembly effort. The engineers found that no two cars were exactly alike, and each possessed unique details and handling characteristics. Jaguar spent quite a bit of time examining the surviving examples in order to correctly replicate the cars and the materials, paying special attention to the original construction methods that were available to the Jaguar craftsmen at the time.



The XKSS continuation cars were the second such effort for Jaguar Land Rover Classic after a run of six lightweight E-types, so the division is certainly gaining experience in restarting the production of half-century-old cars.

"Re-creating the nine D-type-derived XKSSs was hugely satisfying and an even bigger technical challenge than the six missing Lightweight E-types, but lessons learned from the XKSS project have been given a head start on the final 25 D-types," said Ken Riches, Jaguar Classic engineering manager, "Each one will be absolutely correct, down to the very last detail, just as Jaguar's Competitions Department intended."



When completed, don't look for these at your local Jaguar dealer -- this is a slightly more *exclusive* offering -- and even though Jaguar is staying mum on the price, you can bet that each example will have a window sticker in excess of a million pounds.

As with the XKSS cars owners will have the opportunity to buy spare parts -- it's better to put that sort of thing in the shopping cart right away since it won't be easy to have those refabricated later. And given the fact that one Ecurie Ecosse D-Type, chassis XKD 501, recently reached the stratospheric auction price of \$21.78 million, the continuation cars (sans racing history) can be considered a bit of a bargain even in seven-figure range.

In short, if you want a D-Type and you want to daily drive it, this is definitely the way to go to avoid risking original Le Mans metal on the street.



ELECTRIC ROAD TRIP: JAGUAR I-PACE TESTED IN LOS ANGELES AHEAD OF 2018 REVEAL Lew George, AJS Newsletter Editor

**December 5, 2017** – One year after its first showing at the Los Angeles Auto Show, the Jaguar I-PACE Concept returned to the city as a production prototype for its final range and durability tests ahead of its global reveal and start of sale in 2018.

Thousands of potential customers around the world have pressed the 'I Want One' button on Jaguar.com to register their interest for the hotly anticipated electric SUV. Not only will these customers be at the front of the queue when order books officially open globally in March, but a lucky few have been chosen to accompany Jaguar's engineers as prototype vehicles complete final validation tests.



Ann Voyer, from Pasadena, California, asked Jaguar if the I-PACE would have enough range to complete her favorite road trip along

California's West Coast. <u>To answer her</u> <u>question, Jaguar engineers took her on a long-</u> <u>distance range test – on one charge only.</u> The I-PACE production prototype drove 200 miles from Los Angeles's Sunset Boulevard to Central California's Morro Bay on a single charge of its advanced Lithium-Ion battery.<sup>1</sup>

Ian Hoban, Jaguar Vehicle Line Director, said: "After 1.5 million global test miles, the I-PACE is ready for production and is proven to deliver long distances on a single charge. Jaguar's first battery electric vehicle will also be fast to charge; our target is a zero to 80 percent charge being achievable in a short break."<sup>1,2</sup>

Full specification and pricing for the Jaguar electric performance SUV will be announced in early 2018 when order books will officially open and a production version of the car is shown. (1) Final U.S. specifications, design, equipment and accessories have not been determined. Therefore, U.S. production vehicles may differ from the one described here. All figures for acceleration, power, speed, range and charging are Manufacturer's estimates based on best information available at time of publication. Jaguar I-PACE production vehicles will continue to be tested and certified prior to release, with official figures available prior to any customer order.
